




Key points from the lecture: Professor Arthur Marwick discusses 'The Fundamentals of History', defining history as 'The bodies of knowledge about the past produced by historians, together with everything that is involved in the production, communication of, and teaching about that knowledge'.

Covering world history from 500 C.E. through the beginning of the 21st century, the speaker shows how human knowledge and experience shifted from the regional to global perspective, and covers critical aspects of the past 1500 years, such as: exploration & imperialism; emergence of world powers; global depression and the world wars of the

20th century; emigration/immigration, industrialization, human rights, technology, terrorismâand other issues we still face today, worldwide. Key events, figures and concepts are concisely explained for this grade range, and callout features illustrate colonialism & globalization, as well as the participants/battles of World Wars I & II.

Outcome of the event: Students acquired the knowledge about the fundamentals of history. It is a privilege of the college to share and exchange ideas, information and views in the form of a guest lecture.
