Paper - V: Radio and Television Journalism

Paper – VI: Media Laws and Ethics

- 1. In each Semester the total marks 100 is divided into two parts
 - a. 60 marks caters to External evaluation and
 - b. 40 marks caters to Internal assessment
- 2. 60 marks External assessment is divided as
 - a. 20 marks in section -A, as short answer questions
 - b. 40 marks in section -B, as long answer questions
- 3. 40 marks in Internal Assessment is divided as
 - a. 10 marks for Assignment
 - b. 5 marks for Viva Assessment
 - c. 5 marks for seminars
 - d. 10 marks for Project work and
 - e. 10 marks for the best of two mid exams
- 4. The Head of the Department has to prepare the list of Examiners nad Paper Setters and will be submitted to the Academic council.
- 5. The committee has approve the syllabus with 5 units for each paper of Paper V and Papar – VI in Semester –V
- 6. The committee has approved the Model Question paper for external exams 60 marks and is divided as follows –

- a. In Section A, answer any *five* questions out of ten. Each question carries 4 marks. Total 20 marks. Two questions from each unit have to be selected.
- b. In Section B, answer all the Five questions. Each question has internal choice.
 Each question carries 8 marks, total for 40 marks. Each question has to be selected from each unit.
- The committee has approved the Blue Print of the Question paper. Question paper has to be designed in such a way that 24 marks have to be obtained from each unit.
- 8. Modifications, if need be in the above resolutions, will be done by the HOD and the faculty members of the Department.

In III B.A. Semester – VI, Paper VII is elective theory paper. Student has to select one elective from two choices.

Those papers are

Elective – A : Public Relations

Elective – B : Advertising

Three Papers - VIII, XI and X are in semester VI as cluster electives. Student has to select one set from two.

- In each Semester for theory paper the total marks 100 is divided into two parts-

- a. 60 marks caters to External evaluation and
- b. 40 marks caters to Internal assessment
 - 60 marks External assessment is divided as
 - a. 20 marks in section A, as short answer questions
 - b. 40 marks in section -B, as long answer questions

- 40 marks in Internal Assessment is divided as
- a. 10 marks for Assignment
- b. 5 marks for Viva Assessment
- c. 5 marks for seminars
- d. 10 marks for Project work and
- e. 10 marks for the best of *two* mid exams
- In the semester VI, Paper –X is designed as Field Work (Reporting and Dissertation in Print/ Electronic media). This paper caters total 100 marks, and distributed as 75 marks for Dissertation, 25 marks for Viva – Voce.
- 2. The Head of the Department had prepared the Model Question Paper and Blue Print for the approval of committee.
- 3. The Head of the Department had prepared the list of Examiners and Paper Setters for the submission of Academic council and Controller of Examinations (Autonomous).
- 4. The Head of the Department has prepared Question bank of semester VI for the submission to Controller of Examinations.
- 5. The other items are
 - The committee has approved the syllabus with 5 units for each paper.
 - For Paper X Field Work, the student has to go field work for 60 teaching hours and the work will be assessed in 30 hours.
 - The committee has approved the Model Question paper for external exams 60 marks and is divided as follows
 - ✓ In Section A, answer any *five* questions out of ten. Each question carries 4 marks. Total **20 marks.** Two questions from each unit have to be selected.
 - ✓ In Section B, answer all the Five questions. Each question has internal choice. Each question carries 8 marks, total for 40 marks. Each question has to be selected from each unit.

- The committee has approved the Blue Print of the Question paper. Question paper has to be designed in such a way that **24 marks** have to be obtained from each unit.
- The committee has approved that all the above resolutions will be effective for **Three Academic Years** i.e., 2019-20,2020-21, and 2021-22.
