

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



In this Lecture, the Resource person creates awareness among the students about the importance of entrepreneurship. He inculcates a desire to become an entrepreneur among the students. 

with

VERMICOMPOST-“GOLD from GARBAGE”

Background in taking up the project:

- Vermicomposting has been gaining a strong foothold in the country due to simple production techniques, ecological, economic and human health benefits associated with it.
- A significant number of vermicomposting units have been set up by entrepreneurs, under government support/ with the technical guidance of Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs), particularly in the southern and central parts of the country.
- Entrepreneurs in the states of Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh (M.P.) have popularized the usage of vermicomposting.
- But this type of initiation is lacking in Andhra Pradesh, so our college has started this from college level as a unit.
- This helps in promoting vermicomposting technology and also reduce pesticides and fertilizer pollution in the environment
- Besides these advantages to environment, students will also try to become future entrepreneur in vermicomposting, self-employment and will develop skill in preparation vermicompost through learning by doing which is the motto of our college.

- **Advantage of vermicomposting:**

Production of compost through rearing/using earth worms is called the vermicomposting technology. Under this technology, earthworms eat biomass and excrete it in a digested form which is known as vermicomposting or vermicompost. It is one of the simplest and cost-effective methods for the production of composting for both the small- and large-scale farmers.

Vermicomposting, rightly called “gold from garbage” is the major input in organic agriculture production. Owing to simple technology, many farmers are engaged in vermicomposting production as it invigorates soil health, soil productivity reduces the cost of cultivation. There is a gradual increase in demand for vermicompost due to the high level of nutrient contents. There are a number of NGOs, Community Based Organisations (CBOs), Self-Help Groups (SHGs), Trusts etc along with NABARD which give financial support and help for self-employment.



INITIATION OF THE PROJECT: As a part of curriculum first year students of zoology studying first semester are taken to vermicompost unit located at Vanukuru Village of Krishna District for the field trip. This vermicompost unit belongs to DVS bio Organics company with which we had mutual exchange of knowledge, field trips, employment etc. the proprietor of the company is Dr. D. Koteswara Rao Retired Degree College Principal of Bantumilli. He was also a faculty of Zoology who worked in a SRR & CVR Govt Degree College before becoming Principal. with this intimacy sir have taken class about the vermicompost preparation, pros and cons in running the vermicompost unit and also financial aspects of how profitable it is to run this unit and also provide employment to the rural people in the area. With such inspirational talks the students of our college you a very much attracted towards establishing the vermicompost unit in our college. All the procedures and precautions that are to be taken care during the establishment and also running the unit were clearly explained by the Sir. He has also provided the initial worms that are to be introduced in the vermicompost units in our college.

PROCEDURE FOR PREPARATION OF VERMICOMPOST:

- Decomposable organic wastes such as animal excreta, kitchen waste, farm residues and forest litter are commonly used as composting materials. In general, animal dung mostly cow dung and dried chopped crop residues are the key raw materials.
- Red earthworm (*Eisenia foetida*) is preferred species of earthworms because of its high multiplication rate and thereby converts the organic matter into vermicompost within 45-50 days. Since it is a surface feeder it

converts organic materials into vermicompost from top. So we selected these species which are also the same species brought from DVS Bio organics.

- Vermicomposting is done in our college following the pit method. Where we used cemented pits in our college. Our vermicomposting unit cool, moist and is present in shady area.
- Cow dung and dried leafy materials collected from our college campus are mixed in the proportion of 3: 1 and are kept for partial decomposition for 15 – 20 days. A layer of 15-20cm of dried leaves/grasses is kept as bedding material at the bottom of the bed. Beds of partially decomposed material of size 10x3x3 feet. Water is sprinkled with can immediately after the release of worms. Beds are kept moist by sprinkling of water (daily) and by covering with gunny bags.
- Once in 15 to 20 days aeration is given by tilting the layers up and down for proper decomposition. Compost gets ready in 45-50 days. The finished product is 3/4th of the raw materials used and also depends on the speed of decomposition and worms.

HARVESTING: When observe black granular material which is nothing but the earthworm castings over the layers, we can stop watering and collect as a heap. which will be sieved and used after two to three days. Students marketed their own prepared products orally and sold to teachers, students, Alumni, Walkers & other stakeholders.

MARKET POTENTIAL Vermicompost has been emerging as an important source in supplementing and substituting chemical fertilizers in agriculture. Vermicompost, also known as 'farmers' friend' is used for general crops and plantation crops. It is a valuable input for sustainable agriculture and wasteland development. It is a growth promoter and helpful in providing

hormones required for plant growth. There is a lot of demand for vermicompost among farmers as its use increases quality of agricultural products and it's price is also cheaper. It is also used widely in pot culture and in home gardens. In addition, many government departments including agriculture, forest and horticulture buy it in bulk. It's demand has decreased over the years. Government agencies and NGOs are popularizing organic agriculture using vermicompost by organizing awareness campaigns and film show in rural and urban areas.

CONCLUSION : With this type of practical work or certificate course will be able learn, get experience in maintenance, marketing etc and become future enterpertuer or can start individual units by utilizing Government loans and subsidies for their own self-employment.

Background of initiation for leaf compost:

- COVID-19 can be seen as a 'late lesson' from an early warning. Environmental degradation increases the risk of pandemics. COVID-19 emerged and escalated through the complex interplay between drivers of change, such as ecosystem disturbance, urbanization, international travel and climate change.
- During this period, our college with huge greenery consisting of number of trees, plants, grass etc have shed their leaves as natural phenomenon.
- But due to lack of regular cleaning, huge waste of dry leaves is collected in the campus.
- Meanwhile during the covid period due to lack of regular monitoring, the earthworms in the vermicompost have died and all the dry organic leaf waste was collected in the vermicompost pits.
- After re-opening of the college, the waste that is collected in the campus were taken up as a project to convert this organic dry was waste as leaf compost.

Scope as Entrepreneur:

- Leaf Composting refers to a series of technical processes from acceptance of the raw materials to the production of compost. A composting system encompasses to a broader scope, including source separation, collection of organic waste and utilisation of compost, in addition to plant processes.
- Compost is in high demand in some areas, allowing businesses to earn net profit margins in excess of 10%, while other markets command razor-thin margins. Average revenue in this industry (which is still young) ranges from


Processing and steps involved:

- The Department of Zoology, started this project of converting this organic waste as leaf compost
- In this practice the students also collected the dry leaf wastes from the campus and deposited in the leaf compost pits.
- The water used for Murrel culture is transferred to leaf compost pits, which is rich in nitrogenous wastes excreted from the fishes that provides additional nutrients to leaf compost.
- During the process of decomposition, the dry leaf waste along with nitrogenous waste water enrich the compost with the macro nutrients and micronutrients
- Here the leaf organic waste and water is recycled and again used as organic manure for the plants with rich nutrients.
- Our Honorable Commissioner of Collegiate Education Dr. Pola Bhaskar IAS has inaugurated the sale of the leaf compost on 24/08/2022.

Aquarium maintenance and Ornamental Fish Entrepreneur

Scope of Entrepreneurship: There is ample scope to develop entrepreneurship on the indigenous fish and plant species having ornamental value. Ornamental fishes of India are contributing about 1% of the total ornamental fish trade. These fishes are exported to the tune of 54 tons, having the value of Rupees 13.08 crores in 2020-21. It registered a growth of 66.55 % in terms of quantity and 20.59% in terms of value in INR. Apart from the ornamental fish, there is a scope for the development of industry on live food and artificial feed and aquarium accessories required for ornamental fish keeping.

Initiation of the project in the college: Generally, our college students go for field visits based on the curriculum. So as a part of curriculum students were taken to local ornamental fish breeding unit located in Gollanapalli of Gannavaram mandal of Krishna district. The proprietor of the breeding unit Sri Sai Baba Sir explained the pros and cons of culturing techniques that are to be followed for viviparous and oviparous ornamental fishes. He also explained the financial aspects of selling them to the local whole sale sellers and retail seller. The economic aspects that were spent on the different types of ornamental fishes was well explained, where students were motivated to culture the ornamental fishes in the aqua tanks provided by the college.

How they become Entrepreneurs

- In the process of ornamental fish culture, students will be able to get an idea about different species of ornamental fishes that are available the local market and those species that are to be imported from other areas
- Through the field visit, they will get an idea about how ornament fishes are being sold in aquarium shops in Vijayawada
- They will get an idea about the business opportunities in sales of aquarium and ornamental fishes
- They will also the types of nets that are used for holding of the ornamental fishes
- They will be able to use different types of nets for different species and organisms in the aquarium
- Students will gain knowledge about the size of the tanks that are maintained based on the density of population
- They will be able to identify the brooders and separate them for breeding
- They will be able to identify different stages of fish from egg to adult and will be about to say the days of age with experience
- The water quality parameters that are maintained in the tanks are used for studying water quality parameters in a practical classes
- They can get an idea about what kind of plants that are available for aquarium maintenance in the market and are able to breed or propagate such types of aquarium plants which can become a second income in the same field.
- They can use different methods for using different types of nets for separating and catching the desired tadpoles/ fishes.



- They will be able to identify reasons for diseases in fishes or growth deficiency that occurs in the aquarium fishes
- They will be able to identify reasons for spread of diseases in ornamental fishes in the aquarium
- They can understand the compatibility of the species and will be able to guide other aquarium lovers
- In an overall summary, the students who are involved in this type of ornamental fish culture will be able to develop into future entrepreneurs in this particular field experience and they will be able to gain knowledge about various schemes that are offered by government, so that they can utilize the schemes to develop into a good entrepreneur or self-employment in this sector.
- **Opportunity provided by the college:**
- On important days of celebrations in the college, such as consumers days on December 24th celebrated by commerce department, Women's Day on March 8th celebrated by women's empowerment cell. Students are given an opportunity to keep stalls like a fair where they can show their talent in marketing, selling, future entrepreneurs.
- Department of zoology students utilized the opportunity and joined in the event and kept Ornamental fish sales with fish from our tanks and other accessories from outside market. this type of experimentation in the market will surely make the students of interest into good entrepreneurs and can also help in self-employment after their education.

Objectives:

The 10-5 schedule may not suit everybody. Many of us must have thought of being self-employed at one point in life. Starting our own business is not easy. It has its pros and cons. However, the pros outweigh the cons when we have a great idea and are willing to work hard for it. It can be a very rewarding experience to be self-employed. All of us must know our strengths and be aware of our weaknesses. The aim is to

1. Enhance their interest, understanding relevance and need to take up Self – employment or Entrepreneurship as a Career
2. Emphasis on differentiating between Wage employment, Self-employment, and Entrepreneurship
3. Developing trade practices in the direction of sustainability and social and environmental cost accountability.

The Context:

Self-employment is concerned with the way in which people create and implement new ideas and methods to produce goods and services. The terms “self-employed”, “entrepreneur”, “business owner” identify anyone who creates his/her own earnings in the form of a business, contract, or freelance activity. A self-employed person is someone who has a job or activity alone or with a small group of people, with or without paid employees.

This program encourages students on different kinds of self-employment ideas that can help people to make money on their own. People might have a job, even though they don't have to give up their job suddenly. They can start a small business, once they think that their business is flourishing, they can take it to the next level.

Being self-employed can make them feel great about themselves.

1. They may be potential to make lumpsum amount of money
2. They may provide employment to others
3. They will get the benefits of tax deductions

Fair Trade is not just a simple commercial relationship but one of partnership founded on equality and respect between the producers of Fair-Trade shops, labelling organizations and consumers. The relationship goes beyond economy. By means of Fair Trade, the committed consumer acquires not only products, but also long-term relations with their producers. This "humanization" of the trade process is a demand shared not only by producers, but also by consumers from the North, a part of which wants more and more to be informed about the origin and social, ethical, and environmental content of the products on offer. In its understanding of sustainable development moreover, Fair Trade naturally includes satisfying the basic needs of producers.

Fair Trade can be defined by four basic conditions or criteria:

- Having a direct relation between producers and consumers, avoiding as much as possible intermediaries and speculators.
- Fair pricing that allows the producer and their family to lead a dignified life.
- "Everyone should be able to live from their work in a dignified way."
- In cases where producers are salaried, respecting working conditions that conform to the minimum international standards recommended either by the International Labour Organisation or the country itself, whichever are the greater, respecting the right to Union representation and prohibiting forced labour.
- The authorization of partial financing before the harvest (in the Fair-Trade movement, the minimum rate is 60%) if the producers so demand.
- The establishment of long-term contracts and relations, based on mutual respect and the respect of ethical values. The aim of these relations is not only a fair price but also sustainable development for groups of producers or wage earners.
- In some cases, Fair Trade organizations have also set up "Progress" criteria as well as minimum criteria.

The Practice

Generally, people tended to be disinterested in self-employment either because they felt that they couldn't start a business due to lack of investment, or because they felt that the ideas were impossible to implement.

A workshop on Hand made Ornaments, training for the students by students organized for six days from 29-01-2018 up to 3-02-2018 by Women empowerment cell. It is a program by the students, to the students. It is aimed at self-employability of girl's students and personal grooming to enhance their fashion sense. 28 students were trained at that time.

Women empowerment cell initiated a training programme on handmade ornaments on 8.2.2022 to encourage students to learn how to make hand made products to get self employment in the future. Nearly 20 students were trained till now and it is a continuous programme. And also providing platform to discuss few ideas relating to self employment, challenges and solutions to start small industries. Students were enthusiastically participated in this training programme organized by the women empowerment cell.

A program "Presentation of proposals to start women self-employment" was conducted for students in our college on 7.3.2022 by Women empowerment cell. It is a program to encourage students to establish self-employment or enterprises without investment (money) or with a little amount of investment. For this program 9 proposals were presented. Out of nine, one best proposal which is very much useful to women to start self-employment without investment has got 1st Cash Prize.

The women empowerment cell is resolved to conduct such type of programmes regularly to encourage students to start business by their own through these business ideas and to become self-sufficient. Through this the women might empower in socially and financially.

The objectives of Fair Trade could be summed up as the following: Obtaining fairer prices and conditions for groups of small-scale producers . Developing trade practices in the direction of sustainability and social and environmental cost accountability. Raising awareness among consumers of their power to contribute to the development of fairer trade. Encouraging sustainable development and the expression of local culture and values within a context of cross-cultural dialogue.

Fair Trade attempts to increase responsibility among producers, who from their side must practice activities that are sustainable and open. The organizations that benefit must exercise internal democracy and be independent of all political parties and the church. They must attempt to find a balance between the local and export markets, whilst preserving nutritional security. The profits from Fair Trade must be shared out collectively, if possible, in local development (employment, health, transport, etc.). Women’s participation must be considered.

Evidence of Success:

India is a booming economy and finding work is relatively easy as compared to a lot of other countries. Since the internet, the country has become a lot closer, and a lot of opportunities have opened for everybody. One of the best examples to start a business without investment is starting a YouTube channel like Cooking, Nutrition, Ideas and tips, Health, Technology, Education, religion

etc. Some of the students are getting income through maintaining YouTube channels, providing home tuition, and developing short films etc

The students were more interested in starting small businesses on their own. And they participated, showcased, and sold their products in the trade fairs organized at the college level by different departments and other colleges also. In the trade fairs, the students have showcased and sold their products like, “best from waste”, hair bands, handmade ornaments like bangles, earrings, and chains etc.

Obtaining fairer prices and conditions for groups of small-scale producers . Developing trade practices in the direction of sustainability and social and environmental cost accountability. Raising awareness among consumers of their power to contribute to the development of fairer trade. Encouraging sustainable development and the expression of local culture and values within a context of cross-cultural dialogue.

Problems Encountered and Resources required

Starting from nothing - Establishing a business and building a client base can be a long, tiring and at times frustrating process. It needs determination to succeed and perseverance, even if progress is slow. Unpredictable finances - income can be irregular, especially in the early days. It may take several months without earning a profit, and always must pay running costs such as rent, insurance and internet access.

To start any business, planning, finance, training, employees, customers, transportation, and business channels are required. The people must remember that there is an opportunity to get loans from government and banks to establish businesses.

Self-employment / Entrepreneurship, on the other hand, contributes directly to Gross National Product (GNP) and it has unique characteristics of ‘self-generation.’ Besides offering employment to others, every enterprise creates necessity for emergence of other economic activities related to services or supplies like transport, marketing, communication, etc. This initiates a chain of activities that creates unending opportunities for employment.

Purpose & Outcome of the Activity:

International women's day is celebrated every year on march 8th. International Women's Day was celebrated for the first in 1911. It is when the Western countries witnessed population growth and the rise of various ideologies due to turbulence in the industrialized world.

In 1908, inequality against women forced them to come ahead and press for campaigns calling for change. It is when 15,000 Garment women workers marched through New York City demanding shorter working hours, better pay, and voting rights. In the year 1909, with the declaration by the Socialist Party of America, the first National Woman's Day (NWD) was observed across the US on February 28.

In 1910, a second International Conference of Working Women was held in Copenhagen. It is when a woman named Clara Zetkin initiated the idea of International Women's Day. more than 100 women from 17 countries, all of them unanimously approved Zetkin's idea that led to International Women's Day becoming the norm.

Soon after the grand decision at Copenhagen in Denmark in 1911, International Women's Day was honoured for the first time in Austria, Denmark, Germany, and Switzerland. Years later, in 1917 women in Russia chose to protest and strike for "bread and peace" on the last Sunday of February, which was 23 February; this date was March 8 as per Gregorian calendar.

1975 was observed as the International Women's Day year. It was celebrated for the first time by the United Nations in 1975 and since then March 8 is being celebrated as International

Women's Day. The UN announced its first annual theme "Celebrating the past, Planning for the Future in 1996.

"Gender Equality Today for a Sustainable Tomorrow" is the theme for this year's celebration. The campaign theme for International Women's Day 2022 is hashtag#BreakTheBias and is asking people to imagine "a world free of bias, stereotypes, and discrimination".

Purple, green, and white are the colors of International Women's Day. Purple signifies justice and dignity. Green symbolizes hope. White represents purity. These colors found their way from the Women's Social and Political Union (WSPU) in the UK in 1908.

Today we are remembering our past and discussing about our achievements and planning for future. Symbolically our women students are presenting an innovative business ideas and setting up stalls to showcase their talent.





- ❖ Using string, tie each bunch together.
- ❖ Join the three groups together.
- ❖ String the bunches together and secure them.
- ❖ Trim stems to the same length.
- ❖ Cellophane the bouquet.
- ❖ Use cello tape to secure it.







NAME OF THE ACTIVITY: DETERGENT POWDER MAKING

A workshop on Manufacture of Detergent Powder was conducted on 23.08.2017 for final year students of MPC, BZC and MBC. 40 students were trained in the process of preparation of detergent powder in safe and hazard free conditions (Do It Yourself). The idea behind this workshop is to provide them with training in the preparation, packing and marketing of household detergent powder in a small scale so that they become a small-scale entrepreneur after completion of their under graduate studies.

If they are successful in the process, the same may be expanded into a small-scale unit with support and cooperation from government or self-finance (own resources).

A detergent is a substance or a mixture containing soaps and surfactants used for washing and cleaning processes.

INGREDIENTS REQUIRED: (For approximately 6 kg product)

Washing soda is used in detergent, to clean especially in hard water, and as a laundry additive to soften water.

Acid slurry is a sulphonation product made by sulphonation of linear alkyl benzene by oleum giving Linear Alkyl Benzene Sulphonic Acid (LABSA) (Soft Acid Slurry) which is the main Raw Material in the formulation of Washing Powder.

Trisodium phosphate (TSP) is a white, granular or crystalline solid, highly soluble in water, producing an alkaline solution. TSP is used as a cleaning agent, that helps to loosen dirt and grime.

Sodium Tri Poly Phosphate (STPP) in detergents acts as a water softener. In hard water (water having high concentrations of Mg^{2+} and Ca^{2+}), detergents are deactivated. Being a highly charged chelating agent, STPP prevents them from interfering with the detergent.

Sodium Sulphate (Glauber's Salt) is used as a filler in detergent, in powder form to increase the quantity of detergent powder.

Sodium Meta Silicate (SMS) is a colorless crystalline hygroscopic and deliquescent solid, soluble in water and is used as a bleaching aid and to enhance the cleaning efficiency of the surfactant in soaps and detergents.

Caustic Soda (NaOH) is used as a cleansing agent.

Sodium Lauryl Sulfate (SLS) is an additive used to increase lather and foam. SLS acts as a surfactant, wetting surfaces, emulsifying or solubilizing oils, and suspending soil so that they can be rinsed away. This ingredient contributes foaming properties to detergent.

Sodium Carboxy Methyl Cellulose (SCMC) is used in detergents as an anti-soil redeposition agent, particle suspender, skin protector, color retention agent, stabilizer, homogenizer and texture protector.

Tinopal gives high level of whiteness and brightness, improves the cleaning efficiency in laundry process, prevents greening after multiple washing cycles, improves whiteness of power detergent.

PROCESS OF MANUFACTURE:

Acid slurry is first neutralized with soda ash and mixture is kept for one hour for completion of reaction.

Other ingredients such as STPP, TSP, Glauber's salt, SCMC, Colors, Scent etc. are then blended to the neutralized acid slurry with continuous mixing.

The mixture is then dried, and packed in suitable packings.

Students from each of Final B. Sc classes namely MPC, BZC, MBC, were involved in the process of making the washing powder and explained the process. This would make them manufacture it in their respective villages and earn a considerable income.

All the raw material were purchased from local markets.

The approximate cost of raw material required for preparing 25kg of detergent was Rs 5000/-.

The approximate yield is 24.3 kgs.

The revenue generated while selling the 24 kg detergent @ Rs130/kg is Rs3120/-.

Net profit for 24 kg's is Rs 1880/-.
