WHAT IS A SEMINAR

ETYMOLOGY: It is a German word taken from Latin **seminarium**

A **seminar** is a form of academic instruction, either at an academic institution or offered by a commercial or professional organization. It has the function of bringing together small groups for recurring meetings, focusing each time on some particular subject, in which everyone present is requested to participate. This is often accomplished through an ongoing Socratic dialogue with a seminar leader or instructor, or through a more formal presentation of research. It is essentially a place where assigned readings are discussed, questions can be raised and debates can be conducted.

All the students were instructed to select one topic from the history of medieval Andhra, according to their interest and prepare at least a five minutes seminar on that particular topic. The activity is conducted from 1 of August to 10th of August. All the students were given a chance and in fact it was mandatory to all the class members. Ten marks is the maximum score and four was kept as a minimum required score.

Outcome of the activity: All the topics related to the history of Medieval Andhra are covered and students got full acquaintance with the topic.

It gave them a chance to face the audience so that helped to overcome stage fear.
